
ONCE A SPARTAN, ALWAYS A SPARTAN!



Paul Fisherkeller #57 is an Alumnus of Deptford Township High School Class of 1982. Mr. Fisherkeller played football for Deptford High School from 1979-1981. During his football career at Deptford, Mr. Fisherkeller was the center on the offensive line and a defensive end. He was also a member of an accountability system known as *"The Brotherhood."* This player regulated system held each of his fellow linemen accountable for not only their play on the field, but also how they acted in the school. *The Brotherhood* expected and demanded a high commitment to excellence from each other on the football field, while showing compassion towards fellow students in the classrooms and hallways of Deptford High School. With this commitment to excellence, the Spartans captured 2 Conference Championships and produced a combined record of 21-7 over his tenure.



Today, Mr. Fisherkeller is a business owner with his brother, John and lives in Pennsauken with his wife Kitty. He still maintains the friendships he created through *The Brotherhood* and Deptford Spartans Football. Mr. Fisherkeller is also the newly appointed Assistant Director of Alumni Relations for our Deptford High School Football Booster Club.



David Clark #36 is also an Alumnus of Deptford Township High School Class of 1982. Mr. Clark played football for Deptford High School from 1979-1981 and was a teammate of Mr. Fisherkeller. During his football career at Deptford, Mr. Clark was All-South Jersey running back and defensive back for the Fighting Spartans. After his outstanding career at Deptford, Mr. Clark went to Penn State University and played under another legendary football coach, Joe Paterno. During Mr. Clark's tenure at Penn State, the Nittany Lions won 2 National Championships- 1982, 1986 and went to 4 bowl games.

Today, Mr. Clark is a retired law enforcement officer and currently lives in Washington D.C. However, you can mostly find him visiting his old friend and teammate Paul Fisherkeller in Pennsauken, NJ.
